

Get out the vote in **Arizona**

Election Day: November 3

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a record-high 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Arizona's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

- No announced changes to voting procedures due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Deadlines to know for voting in Arizona

Voter registration deadline:

October 5, 2020

Twenty-nine days before an election.

Early in-person voting deadlines:

Early in-person voting **begins 27 days before the Election.**

In-person absentee voting **ends the Friday before the Election**, but some counties may offer emergency early voting through November 2.

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 23, 2020

11 days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Must be received by 7:00 pm on November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

The state recommends voters mail their ballots back by October 28, 2020 to ensure it arrives on time.

Voter ID Requirements

Photo ID such as:

- AZ Driver's license or
- AZ state ID
- Tribal ID
- Federal, state or local government-issued ID
- AZ Vehicle registration or insurance card
- Tribal ID
- Property tax statement
- Recorder's certificate
- Voter registration card
- Federal, state or local ID
- Any mailing labeled "official election material"

Or Two (2) non-photo items such as:

- Utility bill
- Recent bank/credit union statement

All of the above: Current or no expiration date; name and address that reasonably match voter's registration; if different address or military or passport lack address, item from 2nd list with correct address
