

# Get out the vote in Florida

### Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a record-high 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

## Florida's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

### Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

No excuse required to request an absentee
 ballot

### 2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

• No announced changes to voting procedures due to the coronavirus pandemic.

### Deadlines to know for voting in Florida

### Voter registration deadline:

October 5, 2020 Twenty-nine days before an election.

### Early in-person voting deadlines:

Early in-person voting begins 10 days before the Election. Varies by county. Voters should contact their county elections office to determine if more early voting dates are available.

`In-person absentee voting ends 3 days before the Election.

### Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 24, 2020

10 days before the election

### **Ballot submission deadline:**

Must be received by 7:00 pm on November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

### **Voter ID Requirements**

Current ID with photo & signature:

- FL driver's license or
  Public assistance ID
  - FL state ID Veterans health ID card
- U.S. Passport
- License to carry
  concealed weapon or

firearm

- Debit or credit card
- Military ID
- Student ID\*
- Retirement center ID
- Neighborhood association ID
- by entity of Federal Government, or of FL, county, or municipality

Employee ID card issued

\*County determines validity if no expiration date If above photo ID has no signature: need additional ID with signature

Provisional ballot counts if signature matches voter registration record
