Election Day: November 3

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Washington, D.C.'s absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

No excuse required to request an absentee

ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

 Coronavirus updates: All active registered voters will receive a Mail In ballot at their registered address beginning the first week in October.

Deadlines to know for voting in Washington, D.C.

Voter registration deadline:

October 13, 2020

Twenty-one days before an election.

Same-day registration is permitted on Election Dav

Early in-person voting deadlines:

Early in-person voting begins at least 10 days before the election.

In-person absentee voting ends 3 days before the election. Varies by county. Voters should contact their county elections office to determine if more early voting dates are available.

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 27, 2020

Seven days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Postmarked by November 3, 2020 (Election Day) and received within 7 days.

Voter ID Requirements

NO ID REQUIRED FOR MOST VOTERS.

FOR FIRST-TIME VOTERS IN A FEDERAL ELECTION: Voter registration requires,

in this order:

- Current driver's license
 number or
- Last 4 digits of social security number or
- State-assigned unique number
- * shows voter's name and address

If haven't provided above information

- Photo ID or
- Copy of utility bill, bank statement, paycheck or government document including check*
