

Get out the **v**ote in California

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did not cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did not vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

California's absentee and mailin voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

Coronavirus updates: Mail-in ballots sent automatically to all voters in the November 3, 2020, general election.

Election Day: November 3



Deadlines to know for voting in California

Voter registration deadline:

October 19, 2020

Fifteen days before an election.

Same-day registration is permitted 14 days before an election and on Election Day

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 27, 2020

Seven days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

By mail: Postmarked by November 3, 2020 (Election Day) and received within 17 days. In person: By 8:00 pm on November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

Voter ID Requirements

NO ID REQUIRED FOR MOST VOTERS. FOR FIRST-TIME VOTERS IN A FEDERAL ELECTION:

Voter registration

requires, in this order: Current driver's

- license number or
- Last 4 digits of social security number or State-assigned unique

number

- including check*
- * shows voter's name and address
