Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Georgia's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

 No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

 Coronavirus updates: Mail-in ballot applications sent automatically to all voters in the June 9, 2020, primary election; no announced changes for the November 3, 2020 general election.

Deadlines to know for voting in Georgia

Voter registration deadline:

October 5, 2020

Twenty-nine days before an election.

Deadlines for special elections are different

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 30, 2020

Friday before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Must be received by November 3, 2020 (Election Day).
