Election Day: November 3

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a record-high 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Hawaii's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

- Every voter receives a mail-in ballot by default

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

- No announced changes to voting procedures due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Deadlines to know for voting in Hawaii

Voter registration deadline:

October 5, 2020

Twenty-nine days before an election.

Same-day registration is permitted during early voting and on Election Day

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

Application Not Required

Automatically sends ballots to all eligible voters

Ballot submission deadline:

Must be received by November 3, 2020 (Election Day), through the mail or at a dropbox location.

The state recommends mailing your ballot back at least 5 days before Election Day.

Voter ID Requirements

Precinct official may ask voter to provide current ID:

- HI driver's license or HI state ID
- Military ID card
- US Passport
- Utility bill* • Bank statement*
- Paycheck*
- Government check*
- Other government document*

* with voter's name and address

If voter's recitation of name, residence address & date of birth matches the poll book, a regular ballot will be provided
