Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did not cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did not vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Kansas's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

No announced changes to voting procedures due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Election Day: November 3



Deadlines to know for voting in Kansas

Voter registration deadline:

October 13, 2020

Twenty-one days before an election.

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 27, 2020

Seven days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Must be postmarked by November 3, 2020 (Election Day) and received by November 6, 2020.

Voter ID Requirements

Photo ID (current though needn't have expiration date; voters age 65 or older: ok if ID is expired):

- Driver's license or state ID card*
- Concealed handgun license*
- US passport
- Employee ID**
 - Military ID issued by Tribal ID
- institution in KS Public assistance ID card**

** issued by municipal, county, state, or federal government office
