

Get out the vote in New Hampshire

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

New Hampshire's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

· Excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

 Coronavirus updates: Voters in the November 3, 2020, general election can cite concerns over COVID-19 as a valid excuse for voting absentee.

Election Day: November 3



Deadlines to know for voting in New Hampshire

Voter registration deadline:

Varies between October 21 and October 28, 2020

Six to 13 days before an election, depending on local supervisors of the checklist.

Same-day registration is permitted on Election Day

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

November 2, 2020

Ballot submission deadline:

Day before the election

Must be received by 5:00 pm on November 3rd, 2020 (Election Day).

Absentee ballots will be accepted by mail, in-person by the voter, or by delivery agent through 5:00 pm on the day before Election Day at the Clerk's office.

Voter ID Requirements

Any of the following photo IDs. The expiration or issuance date cannot exceed 5 years. If you are 65 or older, your ID is acceptable even if it is expired.

- Driver's license from any state or federal government
- Non-driver's ID card issued by any state
- Military ID

- US passport
 Student ID issued by
 listed institutions in
 New Hampshire
- Any other photo ID considered legitimate

Any voter who does not present an approved photo ID, or have their identity verified by an election official, will be permitted to vote after signing a challenged voter affidavit
