

Get out the vote in South Carolina

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a record-high 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

South Carolina's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

· Excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

• Coronavirus updates: Prepaid postage provided for all returned ballots in the November 3, 2020, general election.

Election Day: November 3



Deadlines to know for voting in South Carolina

Voter registration deadline:

October 4, 2020

Thirty days before an election.

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 30, 2020

Four days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Received by 7:00 pm on November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

Voter ID Requirements

Current photo ID:

- SC Driver's License or DMV ID card
- US Passport
- Military ID issued by federal government
- SC Voter Registration card

If you cannot obtain a valid ID because of a "reasonable impediment," you can list such impediment; present your current, non-photo registration card; and sign an affidavit so your provisional ballot will count.
