

Get out the vote in **Tennessee**

Election Day: November 3

Why should you vote?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, 43% of the eligible voting-age population (nearly 100 million Americans) did *not* cast a vote for president; and 38.6% did *not* vote for any office.

In 2016, the Black voter turnout rate declined for the first time in 20 years in a presidential election, falling from a recordhigh 66.6% in 2012 to 59.6% in 2016.

Tennessee's absentee and mailin voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

· Excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

 Coronavirus updates: Absentee/mail-in ballot eligibility in the November 3, 2020, general election extended to individuals and caretakers sensitive to COVID-19.



Deadlines to know for voting in Tennessee

Voter registration deadline:

October 4, 2020

Thirty days before an election.

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

October 27, 2020

Seven days before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

Received by close of polls on November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

Voter ID Requirements

Photo ID with voter's name, even if expired:

- TN driver license or TN state ID
- US Passport
- ID issued by TN Department of Safety and Homeland Security
- ID issued by federal or TN state government
- US Military ID
- TN handgun carry permit

NOTE: College student ID unacceptable

*Can sign form under oath if unable to afford documents to get photo ID *
